Legalization Process in Kenya

• Police Clearance Certificate (previously Certificate of Good Conduct)

Once obtained from the Directorate of Criminal Investigations (DCI's) Office, it is then presented to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (Huduma Centre window), City Square Nairobi where the certificate will be verified, stamped and finally brought to the Embassy for legalization at a fee of Kshs. 973 cash. Kindly come with the exact amount as much as possible.

• Medical Certificate

This document is initially obtained from a medical doctor and presented to the Kenyan Medical Practitioners & Dentist Board (opposite the Chinese Embassy in Kilimani area) for verification and stamping, proceeded by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs office at the Huduma Centre, City Square Nairobi and there after presented at the Embassy for Legalization at a fee of Kshs. 973 cash. Kindly come with the exact amount as much as possible.

• Academic Certificates

Normally academic documents are initially presented to the Ministry of Education Nairobi for verification, proceeded by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Huduma Centre, City Square Nairobi and finally presented to the Embassy for the final stage of Legalization at a fee of Kshs. 973 cash. Kindly come with the exact amount as much as possible.

• Birth Certificate

It is normally presented to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Huduma Centre, City Square Nairobi and finally to the Embassy for Legalization at a fee of Kshs. 973 cash. Kindly come with the exact amount as much as possible.

• Marriage Certificate

It is normally presented to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Huduma Centre, City Square Nairobi and finally to the Embassy for Legalization at a fee of Kshs. 973 cash. Kindly come with the exact amount as much as possible.
